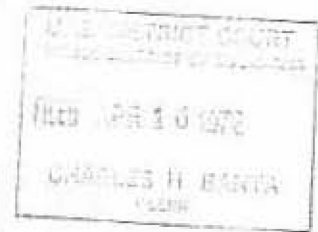

GENERAL ORDER  
NUMBER 9

WHEREAS, Public Law 92-208; 85 Stat. 741 provided for the creation of the Middle District of Louisiana, and

WHEREAS, said Middle District of Louisiana is composed of the same geographical area previously encompassed within the Baton Rouge Division of the Eastern District of Louisiana,

Now, therefore, pursuant to the authority granted by the provisions of Section 1405 of Title 28, United States Code,

IT IS ORDERED that upon the effective date of said Public Law 92-208, all civil cases, including Civil Actions, Admiralty Actions, Miscellaneous Actions, Bankruptcy Actions, and all other actions, except criminal proceedings, theretofore filed and then pending on the docket of the Baton Rouge Division of the Eastern District of Louisiana be, and they are hereby transferred to the docket of the Middle District of Louisiana, and the Clerk is hereby authorized to make such transfers and to do all such things as may be necessary to carry out this order.
