GENERAL ORDER  
NUMBER 21

WHEREAS, Public Law 92-208, 85 Stat. 741, provided for the creation of the Middle District of Louisiana, and

WHEREAS, said Middle District of Louisiana is to be composed of the same geographical area previously encompassed within the Baton Rouge Division of the Eastern District of Louisiana,

Now, therefore, pursuant to the authority contained in Section 1405 of Title 28 of the United States Code:

IT IS ORDERED that all naturalization petitions and all citizenship or nationality matters and proceedings filed pursuant to the provisions of the Immigration and Nationality Act which are, upon the effective date of Public Law 92-208, pending on the docket of the Baton Rouge Division of the Eastern District of Louisiana, be and they are hereby transferred to the docket of the Middle District of Louisiana, and the Clerk is hereby authorized to do all things necessary to carry out the provisions of this order.
