The Merit Selection Panel shall, in accordance with the Federal Magistrate Act of 1979 and following the procedure, qualifications and other regulations established by the Judicial Conference, investigate the qualifications of applicants for the office of United States Magistrate Judge for the Middle District of Louisiana and shall submit a report to the Court not more than sixty days after the date of this order specifying the five persons the Panel has determined as best qualified.


All information available to members of the Panel in performance of their duties, including the names of potential nominees and the identity of individuals recommended by the Panel shall be kept in strict confidence and a statement regarding confidentiality shall be included in all notices published.

The Co-chairpersons of the Merit Selection Panel shall preside at all meetings, shall arrange the meetings, and may organize the Panel into subcommittees and otherwise provide for such division of duties as they may consider appropriate.

Administrative and housekeeping support for the Merit Selection Panel shall be provided by the Clerk of the United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana.

## PUBLIC NOTICE FOR APPOINTMENT OF NEW MAGISTRATE JUDGE

---

The Judicial Conference of the United States has authorized the appointment of a full-time United States Magistrate Judge (15-USDC-7) for the Middle District of Louisiana in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

The duties of the position are demanding and wide-ranging: (1) conduct of most preliminary proceedings in criminal cases; (2) trial and disposition of misdemeanor cases; (3) conduct of various pretrial matters and evidentiary proceedings on delegation from a district judge; and (4) trial and disposition of civil cases upon consent of the litigants.) The basic authority of a United States magistrate judge is specified in 28 U.S.C. 636.

To be qualified for appointment an applicant must:

- Be, and have been for at least five years, a member in good standing of the bar of the highest court of a state, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Territory of Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, or the Virgin Islands of the United States, and have been engaged in the active practice of law for a period of at least five years (with some substitutes authorized);
- Be competent to perform all the duties of the office; be of good moral character; be emotionally stable and mature; be committed to equal justice under the law; be in good health; be patient and courteous; and be capable of deliberation and decisiveness;
- Be less than seventy years old; and
- Not be related to a Judge of the District Court.

A merit selection panel composed of attorneys and other members of the community will review all applicants and recommend to the District Judges in confidence the five (5) persons it considers best qualified. The court will make the appointment following an FBI full-field investigation and an IRS tax check of the applicant selected by the court for appointment. An affirmative effort will be made to give due consideration to all qualified applicants without regard to race, color, age (40 and over), gender, religion, national origin, or disability. The current annual salary of the position is \$185,012. The term of the office is eight (8) years.
