

WHEREAS, the Act of December 18, 1971, created the above entitled District; now, therefore, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. 752, 28 U.S.C. 753, and 28 U.S.C. 755,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:


1. All law clerks, secretaries, court reporters, criers and bailiffs employed by the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Louisiana, Baton Rouge Division, immediately prior to the effective date of said Act, are hereby appointed to their respective positions in and with the above entitled Court, with the same powers and duties as before, at their respective grades and salaries as existing immediately prior to the effective date of said Act, with credit to be given in the future for promotions and step increases in salary for past services prior to the effective date of said Act.

2. Said law clerks, secretaries, court reporters, criers and bailiffs are continued in their respective positions for the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Louisiana, Baton Rouge Division, for the purpose of performing such duties as may be required of them in said District and Division as it existed prior to the effective date of the above Act.

3. In the event individual appointments may be required, such appointments will be effective as of the effective date of said Act.

This Order shall become effective commencing April 16, 1972.
