
GENERAL ORDER NUMBER 60

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that all fulltime United States Magistrates for the Middle District of Louisiana, be and they are hereby specifically authorized and designated to perform the following duties without any other specific reference, designation or order issued by a United States District Judge:


- (1) Issue arrest warrants, search warrants, and complaints
- (2) Set bond
- (3) Conduct proceedings as provided by Rule 5, 5.1 and 40 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure
- (4) Conduct the arraignment and trial of misdemeanors in accordance with the Rules of Procedure for the Trial of Misdemeanors before United States Magistrates and 18 U.S.C. §3401
- (5) Perform any other duty conferred or imposed upon United States Commissioners by law or by the Rules of Criminal Procedure for the United States District Court
- (6) Appoint counsel and approve payment of vouchers for court-appointed counsel
- (7) Appoint persons or approve services as provided and allowed by the Criminal Justice Act

- (8) Conduct arraignments in felony cases where not guilty pleas are entered
- (9) Issue the Uniform Discovery Order in criminal cases
- (10) Conduct pretrial conferences in criminal cases
- (11) Issue administrative inspection warrants
- (12) Issue orders for the drawing of prospective jurors from the master wheel and from the qualified wheel for this district.
