IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Court, in accordance with the provisions of United States Code Title 28, Sections 2041 and 2042, or any like statute, that the Fidelity National Bank of Baton Rouge, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, be and it is hereby designated as the Depository for the moneys of the United States District Court, Middle District of Louisiana, in all cases arising in the Middle District of Louisiana.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, in accordance with the provisions of United States Code Title 28, Sections 2041 and 2042, or any like statute, the Fidelity National Bank of Baton Rouge, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, as depository, furnish and deposit in pledge to secure the prompt repayment of the deposits in accordance with the provisions of Section 1126 of the Revenue Act of 1926, as amended (U. S. Code, Title 6, Section 15), United States Treasury Bonds or Notes into the custody of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta, New Orleans Branch, to be governed by the provisions of its Operating Circular No. 20 dated November 15, 1962; it being

understood that in case said collateral declines in value or becomes unsatisfactory for other cause, this Court may require that there be substituted for it collateral satisfactory to this Court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all deposits to the Registry Account of the United States District Court, Middle District of Louisiana, after this date shall be made in the Fidelity National Bank of Baton Rouge, and each check drawn against said Registry Account shall be drawn on the Fidelity National Bank of Baton Rouge.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the said Fidelity National Bank of Baton Rouge report in writing to the Clerk of this Court once each month the amount on deposit to the credit of this Court; and Fidelity National Bank of Baton Rouge may affix to each check drawn on it a notation to the effect that the check is payable in accordance with this order.
