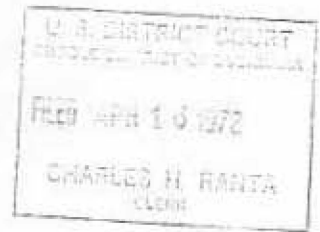


WHEREAS, Public Law 92-208; 85 Stat. 741 provided for the creation of the Middle District of Louisiana, and


WHEREAS, said Middle District of Louisiana is composed of the same geographical area previously encompassed within the Baton Rouge Division of the Eastern District of Louisiana,

Now, therefore, IT IS ORDERED that on the effective date of said Act:

The custody of and responsibility for all the furniture and equipment belonging to or used by the United States District Court, Eastern District of Louisiana, Baton Rouge Division, as it existed immediately prior to said Act, (including all furniture and equipment belonging to or used by the office of the Clerk, United States Magistrate, Referee in Bankruptcy, and Probation Officer in said District and Division are hereby transferred to the United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana, as defined in said Act.
