GENERAL ORDER NUMBER 25

IT IS ORDERED that the United States Magistrates attached to the United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana be, and they are hereby authorized to conduct preliminary interviews, as required by law, in connection with persons charged with parole violations and arrested on parole board warrants. Such interviews shall be conducted, when necessary, by a United States Magistrate in accordance with the rules, regulations, and procedures established by the United States Probation Officer attached to this Court, and in accordance with existing law.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this General Order shall become effective on September 28, 1972, and shall remain in full force and effect unless and until altered, rescinded or revoked by further order of this Court.
