ORDER OF COURT APPOINTING UNITED STATES MAGISTRATE

In accordance with the authority conferred by 28 U.S.C. §631, et seq., and the further authority granted and action taken by the Judicial Conference of the United States,


**IT IS ORDERED** that **STEPHEN CHARLES RIEDLINGER** be, and he is hereby appointed as Full-Time United States Magistrate for the Middle District of Louisiana with his official station being designated as Baton Rouge, Louisiana.


The United States Magistrate shall enter upon the performance of his duties on the 29th day of May, 1986, but prior to the commencement of such duties he shall take the oath of affirmance prescribed by 28 U.S.C. §§453 and 631(g).

The Full-Time United States Magistrate is to hold and discharge the duties of his office for a term of eight (8) years from the date of his appointment subject to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. §631(e), unless sooner removed.

The Clerk will cause certified copies of this order to be spread upon the record of this Court and shall likewise forward a certified copy of this order to the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Court, as required by 28 U.S.C. §631(h).
