
Unclaimed restitution payments arise when a restitution payment ordered by the court is not negotiated by the intended recipient or the intended recipient cannot be located.

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2042, the aforesaid type of restitution funds have been deposited into the United States Treasury pending the identification of a valid address.

The court has determined the need to establish procedures to disburse funds deposited into the United States Treasury in restitution cases by means of an Order of the Court, if a valid address is supplied by the United States Attorney's Office or United States Probation Office.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that upon delivery to the Clerk of this Court of written notification from either the United States Attorney for the Middle District of Louisiana or the United States Probation Office to the effect that a valid address for an aforesaid victim has been identified, the Clerk of this Court shall affect the disbursement of those funds to the aforesaid victim at the valid address.
