ORDER

The Administrative Office of the United States Courts, based on the recommendation of the Judicial Conference, modified language in certain forms¹ on October 7, 2011. That modification being a change in standard condition number two from "the defendant shall report to the probation officer and shall submit a truthful and complete written report within the first five days of each month" to "the defendant shall report to the probation officer in a manner and frequency directed by the court or probation officer." This change was motivated, in part, to eliminate redundant reporting.

Certain cases within this district are subject to the unmodified version of standard condition number two, while some are subject to the modified version. To preserve the Court's resources and create uniformity within the district, the language of standard condition number two, as modified on October 7, 2011, should apply to all criminal judgments subject to the jurisdiction of the Court. Those persons required to submit a truthful and complete written report within the first five days of each month should instead be required to report to the probation officer in a manner and frequency directed by the court or the probation officer.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED the modified language of standard condition two be applied to all cases under supervision within this court's jurisdiction.
