**ORDER** 

Pursuant to Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 58(d)(1), the Court may adopt

a local rule for petty-offense and other misdemeanor cases to "accept a fixed-sum

payment in lieu of the defendant's appearance and end the case." Fed. R. Crim. P.

58(d)(1). This Court's Local Criminal Rule 58(a)(1) establishes that the "offenses

named in the Schedule of Offenses designated by the Court may be disposed of by

payment of the fixed sum provided in the schedule in lieu of a personal appearance

before a Magistrate Judge." M.D. La. LcrR 58(a)(1). The Court instituted the current

Schedule of Offenses through General Order Number 1998-10.

Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that General Order Number 1998-10, entered December

22, 1998, is **AMENDED**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Schedule of Fixed Sums for Petty

Offenses Committed on Federal Courthouse Property, attached hereto, is

**ADOPTED** by this Court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in the interest of justice, efficient court administration, and effective law enforcement concerning the petty offenses listed in the Schedule of Fixed Sums for Petty Offenses Committed on Federal Courthouse Property ("Schedule") occurring within the territorial jurisdiction of the United States District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana, collateral in the amount prescribed in the Schedule may be posted in lieu of the appearance of the offender. Upon the election of the person charged with such an offense to post such collateral in lieu of an appearance before the United States Magistrate Judge for trial of that offense, the collateral in the amount listed in the Schedule opposite the offense shall be forfeited to the United States. The posting of such collateral shall signify that the offender neither contests the charge nor requests a hearing before the United States Magistrate Judge, and such collateral shall be administratively forfeited to the United States. If the collateral is forfeited, such action shall be tantamount to a finding of guilty. Nothing in the Schedule is meant to preclude a federal officer or official from filing a complaint against a violator and having that violator appear before a United States Magistrate Judge. If the person charged with an offense listed in the Schedule fails to post and forfeit collateral, any punishment, including fine, imprisonment, or probation, may be imposed within the limits established by law upon conviction by plea or after trial.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of Court shall make this Schedule available for public inspection at the Russell B. Long Federal Building and United Sates Courthouse and shall make this Schedule available electronically on the Court's website.
