

INSTRUCTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR MEDIA IDENTIFICATION CARD APPLICATION

The Media Identification Card is non-transferable. It provides an exception to the Court's Policy regarding Electronic Devices for non-members of the legal bar. In other words, the ability to acquire a Media Identification Card is a privilege. A valid Media Identification Card will entitle a media member with the ability to bring a laptop with silent keyboard, tablet, and/or a smart phone that must be off or in silent mode into a courtroom. All Media Identification Cards will be subject to the provisions of Local Rule 83(c)(10), which prohibits photographing, broadcasting, and recording in the courtroom or its environs.

All applications for Media Identification Cards must be submitted to the Office of the Clerk of Court—Media Liaison, Russell B. Long Federal Building and United States Courthouse, 777 Florida Street, Suite 139, Baton Rouge, LA 70801.

The application is to be completed by each applicant and certified by an Editor or News Director, unless Self-Employed. In the event of the latter, the applicant must provide at least two media references from agencies that recently hired him/her on a freelance basis.

Media Identification Cards will be valid for two (2) years. They will only be issued to fulltime members of the media who have a need for an identification card in order to fulfill their various assignments. Media Identification Cards will not be issued to individuals who are employed in the business, advertising, or circulation departments.

First time and renewal applicants **must** include the following items with their application:

- A cover letter from the applicant's Editor or News Director requesting credentials for the individual. If numerous applications are being filed, one letter with all of the applicants' names will suffice.
- For independently employed applicants, media reference letters from at least two agencies that have recently hired them on a freelance basis. The Company Name box on the application should indicate that the applicant is "Self Employed."

The Court reserves the right to perform a background check and due diligence examination on those issues that would bear directly on the Applicant's ability to acquire a Media Identification Card.

If issued a Media Identification Card, it must be visibly displayed outside of the holder's clothing at all times while in the Courthouse.

LOCAL RULE 83(c)(9) Cameras and Electronic Equipment provides in pertinent part:

(A) Unless authorized by the Court, no camera, recording equipment, cellular telephone, tablet, pager, laptop computer or other type of electrical or electronic device shall be brought into the premises. No person shall introduce or attempt to introduce any type of camera, recording equipment, or other type of electrical or electronic device into the premises without court permission. No person shall introduce any type of camera, recording equipment or other type of electric or electronic device into the premises without source premission. No person shall introduce any type of camera, recording equipment or other type of electric or electronic device into the premises while, or immediately before or after, the grand jury is in session.

(C) The permission to bring a cell phone, pager, smart phone, laptop or tablet into the building is subject to the following sanction: Any cell phone, pager, smart phone, laptop or tablet which rings or makes any other noise in the courtroom, chambers or in the hallways outside of a courtroom shall be subject to seizure and may not be returned to the owner.

LOCAL RULE 83(c)(10) Photographs, Radio, or Television Broadcasting provides in pertinent part:

- (A) The taking of photographs in the courtroom or its environs, or radio or television broadcasting from the courtroom or its environs, during the progress of or in connection with judicial proceedings, including proceedings before a judicial officer, whether or not court is actually in session, is prohibited.
- (B) As used in these rules the term "environs" means any place within any United States Courthouse wherein these Rules apply, and any place wherein a Judicial Officer may conduct judicial proceedings and any public place immediately adjacent thereto.
- (C) Use of audio, video and photographic recording equipment is banned from all areas of the courthouse grounds other than the areas expressly permitted in this paragraph. Permitted areas consists of the area located east and directly adjacent to the south half of the front courthouse steps, referred to as the "media bullpen," and the public sidewalks and flagpole areas located on the perimeter of the courthouse block (see diagram posted on the Court's website).
